When to plant	Plant as soon as possible.
Where to plant	Garden border / patio container

Plant hardiness	Hardy
Flower colour	white

Planting distance in ground (cm)	Plant as a specimen.
Mature plant height (cm)	90cm
Mature plant width (cm)	90cm
Flowering period	Fruits from mid-July to September
Type of soil	Any well-drained soil. Soil-based compost such as John Innes No 2 in containers.
Key wildlife attracted	Pollinating insects

On arrival (illustration of plant size – not exact variety) 	• Open the box fully and carefully lift out the plant. • Remove the polythene bag and dispose of responsibly, keeping it away from children. • Water the plant if the compost seems dry and allow excess water to drain away. • Best planted out immediately. However, the plant will hold for several days in a light place and kept moist. • Please recycle all packaging appropriately.
Where to plant	<u>PLANTING IN GROUND (BED OR BORDER)</u> • Water thoroughly before planting and remove the pot. • Prepare the ground well by digging in plenty of well-rotted compost or manure. • Dig a hole at least twice the size of the pot. Ideally add 1-2 scoops of Root Booster or a granular fertiliser to the soil. • Spike the bottom and sides of the hole with a fork to allow roots to penetrate. • Place the plant in the centre, with the top of the rootball level with the soil. Fill in the gaps with soil, firming around the plant to remove air pockets. • Give the ground a good soaking. • If possible, spread a 7cm layer of bark or mulch around the plant but not touching the stem. This locks in moisture and prevents weeds. <u>PLANTING IN CONTAINERS</u> • Add a layer of drainage material to the pot. • Fill with fresh compost with added horticultural grit. Add 1-2 scoops of Root Booster and proceed as above. • Add a 7cm layer of bark or mulch around the plant but not touching the stem. This locks in moisture and prevents weeds Top Tip: Growing plants up support or frame will increase fruiting and prevent disease
Watering	Keep the soil or compost consistently moist. Water deeply when the top of the soil dries out.
Pruning / trimming	Keep the area around the plant weed free. After fruiting, cut back the canes that have fruited down to the ground.
Feeding	Apply a high potash fertiliser such as Easy Feed/Flower Power in the spring and again in the summer.
Winter Care	Apply mulch before winter.
Container Planting	One plant per 45cm container.
